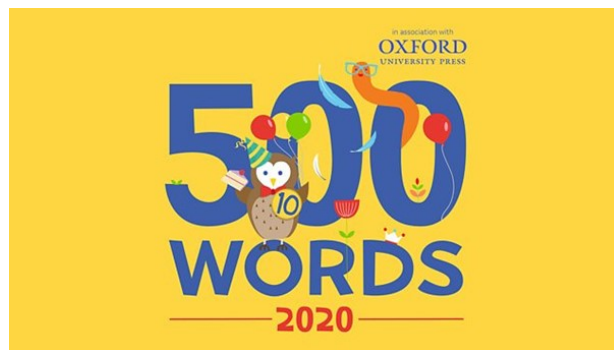


Our School Attendance target is 96%. Whole School Attendance is currently 95.79%

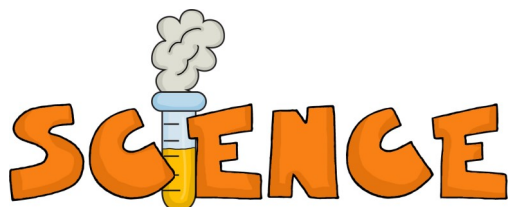
Challenge Time!
