



History Endpoints

To be able to select suitable sources of evidence and give reasons for choices; start to seek out and analyse a wide range of evidence to justify interpretations of the past.

Give an overview of life in Britain and events in the rest of the world, up to and including modernity. Be able to describe characteristic features of the past: ideas, beliefs and attitudes, experiences of men, woman and children.

Describe changes in a period of history using terms such as: social, religious, political, technological and cultural. Understand continuity of change over time and represent this on timelines.

Use historical vocabulary to communicate: dates, years, decades, centuries, time period, change, chronology, era, continuity and legacy.

Use literacy, numeracy and computer skills to communicate and present information and ideas about the past.
