Vocabulary

Samaritan – a charitable or helpful person (Luke 10:33)

Parable – a simple story used to illustrate a moral or spiritual lesson, as told by Jesus in the Gospels.

Moral – a lesson that can be learnt from a story or experience.

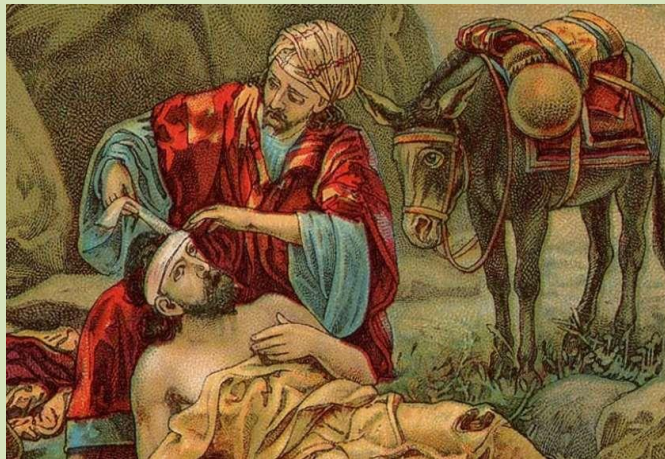
Dilemma – a situation where a difficult decision needs to be made between two or more alternatives, especially when one is undesirable.

Levite – a member of the Hebrew tribe of Levi.

The Good Samaritan

The parable of the good Samaritan is told by Jesus in the gospel of Luke. It is about a traveller who is stripped of clothing beaten and left for dead on the roadside. First a Jewish priest and then a Levite come along but both avoid the man. Eventually a Samaritan finds him and restores him to health.

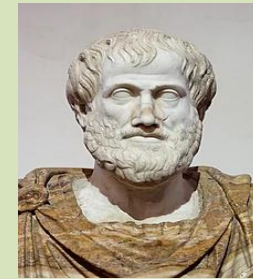


What is Philosophy?
